

## Sidewalk, Curb and Road Repairs

**Contract: 17TEY- 100TU**

**Start Date: 30 October, 2017**

*\*Timeline is subject to change due to unforeseen events.*

The City of Toronto will be repairing cuts made to the sidewalk and/or road by utility companies, private contractors and the City when installing or repairing underground infrastructure (water, sewer, natural gas, cable, etc.). The repairs will take place.

**LOCATION: COLLEGE STREET**

Repair work will be coordinated with any maintenance work required with the City's right-of-way. This work will keep our sidewalk, curb and roads in a state of good repair.




**Work Details**




In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move on-site with equipment and prepare the work area before construction begins. Street furniture (planters, bike parking, benches, information pillars, etc) located within the construction work area will be temporarily removed. Construction crews will:

- excavate a section of sidewalk or curb and roadway
- pour concrete to form a section of sidewalk or curb
- repair curbs and driveways
- repave the road surface

**What to expect during construction**

As with all construction projects, you may experience dust, noise and temporary inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p><b>Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Residents that require accommodation must contact the City Inspector to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area with Local Access signs, revising traffic signal timing and informing the public of alternate routes during this planned work. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>

	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner (Call <b>416-808-2222</b> for the location of your vehicle.)</p> <p>You may park outside of the construction work zone. Please arrange to park elsewhere on streets that allow on-street parking and be aware of parking restrictions on the street.</p> <p><b><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Construction Inspector listed below, so that your tickets can be cancelled.</i></b></p> <p>Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles have parked in illegal parking spots such as hydrant violations or no parking zones or if they are submitted to the Construction Inspector later than <b>three days</b> of receipt.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b><u>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</u></b></p>
	<p><b>TTC Service:</b>  <b>*OPTIONAL:</b> Include messaging depending on whether bus stop moved, detour of bus or streetcar*          Review with Diego Sinagoga, TTC - Diego.Sinagoga@ttc.ca</p>
<p><b>Restoration</b></p>	<p>The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>

### Important Details

Property owners in the construction area are advised to remove any items installed or planted beyond the private property line and in the City-owned right-of-way that may impact construction. If you have a lawn sprinkler system located within City property, please contact the Inspector to arrange for a site inspection. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on City property.

### Work Hours

Work will take place from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. \*Messaging to match work schedule\*
